



Our History

Commencing operations in 1995 with 41 students, two teachers and two demountables, the school has grown steadily with the introduction of secondary education in 2005.

Today, Medowie Christian School is a healthy, thriving learning centre delivering quality education for students from Kindergarten to Year 12. Our school has a multimillion dollar multipurpose hall with full-size basketball court. All classrooms are fully air-conditioned and equipped with interactive technology.

MCS is accredited and registered with the NSW Board of Studies and active members of Christian Schools Australia (CSA) and the Association of Independent Schools (AIS).

Our Educational Philosophy

MCS strives to provide a centre of teaching and learning excellence which reflects a Christian world view, dedicated to nurturing the whole child - academically, emotionally, socially, spiritually and physically. As a Christian educational community, we offer academic

programs that promote critical and creative thinking, founded on Biblically based values, beliefs and behaviours. We are passionate about recognising and developing the abilities of each student, encouraging them to achieve at their personal best in everything they do.

Learning Enhancement

MCS has a strong commitment to support and enrich the learning experience of all its students. The staff of the Learning Enhancement Department work collaboratively with students, class teachers and parents to deliver effective differentiated instruction for students with learning difficulties or special abilities.

Students with learning difficulties are supported by individual, in class or small group sessions, or through targeted intervention programs, while highly able students are extended through enrichment activities within the classroom and through a growing number of interest-based small groups and activities.

Behaviour Management

Behaviour Management is the term we use for discipline and welfare. In partnership with parents, we aim to provide a rich and supportive context for the personal, spiritual and social development of each child.

PRIMARY SCHOOL

Primary

At Medowie Christian School, we aim to provide your child with a safe, nurturing environment in which to make new friends, discover the world around them and explore the endless possibilities that come from independent, collaborative and whole class activities.

Our teachers are committed to giving your child a caring and positive experience of school as they begin their journey of lifelong learning.

In partnership with parents we are delighted to lovingly guide each child as they grow into all that God has called them to be.

Staging

We follow the Board of Studies curriculum which is based on stages of learning. Each stage is equivalent to two school years with Early Stage 1 being the exception.

- Early Stage 1: Kindergarten
- Stage 1: Years 1 and 2
- Stage 2: Years 3 and 4
- Stage 3: Years 5 and 6

Each class has its own teacher who will be with the students for most lessons. Depending on student needs there may be times when students are grouped together for Literacy and Mathematics and are taught by another teacher of that stage.

A streamed Guided Reading program is run across Stages 1 to 3. Students are grouped according to benchmarked reading levels with each group focusing on two to three levels.

This allows for intensive teaching, targeted at students' specific needs. Students are tested regularly and change groups according to their progress.

A range of reading schemes are used including Rigby Collections, PM readers and a program called MiniLit for our struggling readers.

Sport in the Primary may at some stage include jump rope, gymnastics, swimming, netball, soccer, basketball, tee ball, AFL, cross country and athletics. Students in K to 2 participate in a yearly SPLASH intensive swimming course.

MCS has a strong commitment to using technology to support quality learning. All staff integrate the use of technology in their teaching and learning programs.

Service and Mission

Our vision at MCS is to educate children so that they are able to understand what it means to serve others. Regular opportunities for mission and service include performances at retirement villages, singing at community carols events and fundraising for our school's Compassion sponsor children.

SECONDARY SCHOOL

At MCS we understand that secondary students desire greater freedom and increasing opportunities to show more responsibility, and to further develop their academic and creative talents. As students move into the senior years of secondary school, the professional relationship between teacher and student becomes more of a learning partnership, helping provide the basis of a friendly, collegial environment.

The Secondary Department offers a broad and balanced curriculum with a strong academic focus, where each student is encouraged to pursue their personal best.

Curriculum

- Yr 7/8 Subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, HSIE (Australian History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship), PDHPE (Personal Development, Health and Physical Education), Technology Mandatory, Christian Studies, Music, Visual Arts, Chapel, Sport and Languages (Japanese in Year 8).
- Yr 9/10 Core Subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, HSIE (Australian History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship), PDHPE (Personal Development, Health and Physical Education), Christian Studies, Chapel and Sport.
- Yr 9/10 Electives: Drama, Music, Visual Arts, Textiles, Japanese, PASS (Physical and Sports Studies), Industrial Technology, Food Technology and Agricultural Technology.
- Yr 11/12 Subjects: Advanced English,
 Standard English, Mathematics, General
 Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics,
 Ancient History, Modern History, Business
 Studies, Legal Studies, Music 1, Visual Arts,
 Textiles, Design and Technology, Software
 Development and Design, Community and
 Family Services (Distance Education), PD/H/
 PE, Japanese Continuers, Food Technology
 and Industrial Technology. Access to VET,
 TVET and Distance Education is available.

Creative and Performing Arts

All students have the opportunity to participate in various performing and creative arts events including MADD nights (Music, Art, Dance, Drama), school musicals and other community performances.

Sport

Secondary students have the opportunity to participate in an increasing number of sports. Many of our students have enjoyed sporting success at a national, state and regional level. Students can participate in a variety of interschool gala days in sports. In 2016, we will be launching our High Performance Sports Academy.

In addition to Cross Country, Swimming and Athletics Carnivals, organised sports may include soccer, cricket, sandboarding, fishing, touch football, AFL, rugby league, basketball, futsal, golf, hockey, netball, volleyball, fitness, tennis, tee-ball, softball, baseball, squash, lawn bowls, cycling, walking groups, ten pin bowling, gymnastics and dance.

Stage 6

Students are able to complete their Higher School Certificate at MCS through an innovative blended HSC model, which has several benefits for senior students. Stage 6 students study English and Mathematics for two years while undertaking two compressed electives in each of Years 11 and 12. This means that the students will complete the Preliminary and HSC courses in two subjects within one year and sit for two HSC examinations at the end of these courses. This may mean that the maximum number of examinations completed at the end of Year 12 is four.

Senior students at MCS have the support and encouragement of all staff through a mentoring program which allows each student to meet regularly with their mentor.

Service and Mission

Mission and service are very important parts of our school culture and provide students with opportunities to help fulfill the vision of the School by serving others in the community, both locally and globally.
